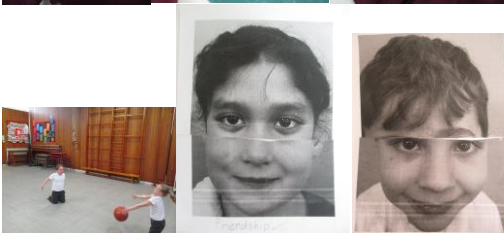

Our Learning Journey

Last week, children drew and labelled a diagram of a rain gauge and listed all the equipment needed to make this measuring device. They have used this information to make their own rain gauges this week. These will be sent home so that children can measure rainfall during the holiday as it links nicely into our maths measurement unit which starts next half term.

During maths, we have looked at odd and even numbers and returned to the greater than and less than signs.

During art, children have been introduced to the work of John Stezaker, a British collage artist and they have created portraits by using half a photograph of a friend's face and half of their own face. This will evolve during next half term into using different types of printed materials to create other works of art.



Focus on Learning

In phonics we are returning to trigraphs such as "ure", "igh" and "ear". We will practise several words that rhyme using these sounds and we will experiment by trying to make our words longer: igh, sigh, light, bright, alright.

Our Stezaker inspired artwork will be on display in our cloakroom by next half term.
